## **Community Dinner**

There is no Free Community Dinner in November. The dedicated Kitchen Committee volunteers will prepare the Election Day Dinner- an important fundraiser for the church. More volunteers are always welcome.

#### **Community Dinner Mission Statement**

To open our doors in a spirit of hospitality, compassion, fellowship and community to provide a free and nutritional meal to all who enter.

"In the breaking of bread we receive and give, growing together."

Our 2010 Youth Group was challenged to develop a Community Outreach Mission. They enthusiastically came up with the idea of preparing and serving a meal, for free, to the community once a month. Our Mission Committee approved a startup fund of \$500. A core group of adults in the congregation helped the youth organize, advertise, and prepare the menu and meal. Coming up on 15 years, it is likely that at least 10,000 dinners have been enjoyed by all who dine in or take out.

While not primarily a fundraiser, the dinner is normally self-funded by donations. We have been able to cover most of the costs of kitchen supplies, equipment, and food. This is because all of you have been here to make it happen. This has allowed us to to support local needs, including the Ti Area Clergy Association, St Mary's School, Hague Baptist Roof Fund, Ambulance Squad, NY/VT Nurses fund, THS Gov't Club, UMCOR, and other church missions.

The Free Community Dinner will return on December 8 with a Lasagna dinner, antipasto salad, garlic bread, sides, and desserts. To thank you for your support all year, this dinner is free to all and donations are not requested.
